

Trail Rules

1. Permitted Uses: hiking, bicycling, cross-country skiing (unroomed), snowshoeing, geocaching, and on-leash dog walking.
2. Hours: ½ hour before sunrise – ½ hour after sunset, unless otherwise posted.
3. Please stay on designated trails, so as not to disturb plants and wildlife. Do not hike off trail or blaze new trails.
4. Dogs are permitted if confined on a leash not exceeding six feet in length. All dogs must have proper vaccinations. Field dog training prohibited.
5. Leave no trace. Properly dispose of all garbage and pet waste in receptacles provided.
6. Seasonal archery hunting for white-tailed deer is permitted within the park Oct. 1–Jan. 1. Hunters will be using the area of the park east of the underground natural gas pipeline and south of the dog park. Separate archery hunting map/rules available.
7. Help keep the Oakland County Parks safe, clean and well-maintained. Report accidents or vandalism to the Oakland County Sheriff's Office at 248.858.4950.
8. Report all injuries to park staff at 248.437.7345.
9. In case of an emergency, dial 911. Park location: 52251 Pontiac Trail, Wixom, MI 48393.

Dog Park Information



For the safety of all dogs and visitors, please note:

- Dogs must be on a six-foot leash until inside enclosure.
- Maximum of two dogs per visitor.
- Dogs must have current license, up-to-date vaccinations, respond to voice command and be in visual control.
- No dogs under four months of age or in heat may enter the park.
- Dogs must be accompanied by an adult (age 18 or older) at all times, even inside the enclosure.
- Owners are responsible for pets at all times. Those creating problems will be asked to leave.
- No food allowed inside dog parks.
- Please clean up pet waste; bags supplied by **PET SUPPLIES** "PLUS"
- In compliance with Michigan Penal Code 750.66, all dog bites must be reported and certain information recorded. See park signage for details.

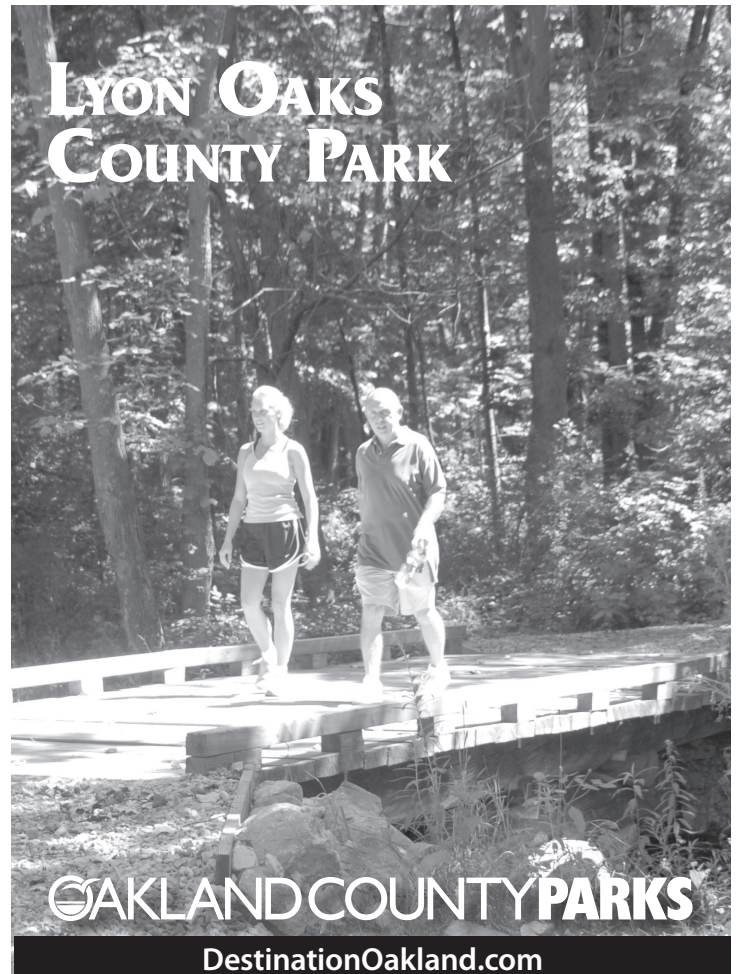

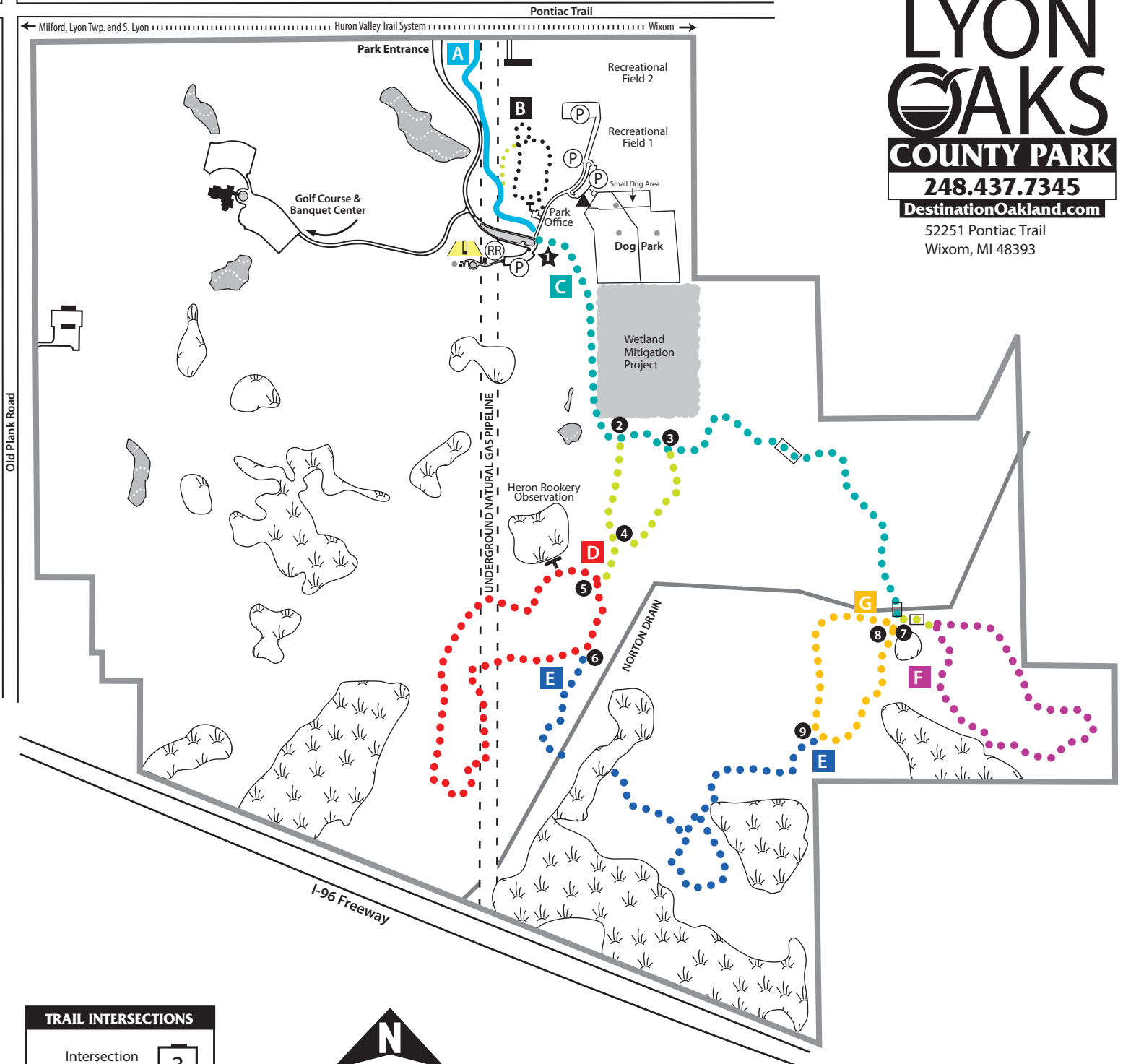

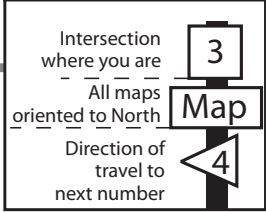

A Prairie Pathway	.35 miles	Paved; slight elevation changes
B Old Orchard Loop	.30 miles	Dirt/woodchip trail; slight elevation changes
C Coyote Corridor	1.03 miles	Gravel/boardwalk; relatively flat
D Heron Loop	1.08 miles	Gravel; relatively flat
E Red-tail Run West	.21 miles	Gravel; relatively flat
E Red-tail Run East	1.09 miles	Gravel; relatively flat
F Fawn Loop	.80 miles	Gravel; slight elevation changes
G Turkey Loop	.52 miles	Gravel; relatively flat
